2020 vision is good news and when it comes with a new decade, then it's worth celebrating. This year sees a fresh start in much of the ministry of SU Tasmania, and with your support, we look forward to realising that vision.

We have already started the year with a new round of chaplaincy funding which has seen new schools taking up chaplaincy, some schools changing how much chaplaincy hours they can offer and sadly, others losing their chaplaincy program altogether. We have been working hard to place new chaplains into schools and helping some principals, new to chaplaincy, to understand the program. This is a busy but exciting time as new people start in new roles and new opportunities open to share God's love.

2020 also sees the start of some new ministries for SU Tas. After many years of wilderness hiking in the north, Boots N' All have recommenced bushwalks in the south of the state. Enjoying God's creation in the company of his people is worth the effort that is required for some of the walks and we thank all of the volunteers who give their time and expertise to lead these walks. Although dependent on the coronavirus situation, a new SUPA (Scripture Union Primary Age) club will eventually be starting in the north-west. A SUPA club is a time for primary school students to have fun, make new friends and open the Bible together. We are grateful for our volunteers who are seeking new ways to connect with their local schools.

Another significant fresh start in 2020 is the move to a national SU which will facilitate more ministry opportunities across the state (see back page). There is much still to be determined and

many new possibilities to explore as we join with our SU colleagues from other states and territories as a national

We ask for your prayers that God will give us clear vision as we navigate these changes and new directions.

SUPPORTING ABUSE SURVIVORS

God loves justice and calls us to make recompense for those who have been wronged. Scripture Union Tasmania is applying to join the **National Redress Scheme**, along with other SU state movements, in order to provide restorative justice, recognition and support to survivors of sexual abuse. This provides redress for survivors of abuse up to an amount of \$150,000 per claim, counselling costs and the possibility of an apology from the institution. Redress is a kinder, simpler, quicker and more accessible way for an abuse survivor to seek compensation, recognition and counselling support, compared with traditional litigation. We ask for your continued prayers and support.

COVID-19 UPDATE

SU Tas is currently acting in accordance with Government advice in regards to our activities and response to the **Coranavirus situation**. At this point our winter camps are still planned to go ahead, but in a limited/ modified format. We will, however, be monitoring the situation and will send any updates if these plans need to change. At this uncertain time we trust our God who never changes and is in control: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in time of trouble" Psalm 46:1.

CHAPLAINCY WEEK

Chaplaincy Week is on again! This year it will be held during the week of 24-31 May and our theme is 'Fresh Start, Clear Vision'. This is an ideal opportunity for churches and communities to celebrate the work of SU Tas chaplains, as they make a positive difference in communities across Tasmania. Many schools celebrate the week with school assemblies, special morning teas, school barbecues and more.

We are also holding a Chaplaincy Week **Art and Media Competition**. A prize for the successful student and a contribution to the school's chaplaincy program is on offer for the winning entry.








VOLUNTEER ISAAC:

We had a skit each day, exploring the building of a great city, all following one architect's plan. We started off with team members filling the roles but by the end had over 10 participants on stage performing the whole skit. They even did a rendition of it at the community barbecue.

One highlight was the percentage of local participants with over 10 from St Helens, a big increase from last year. One of them even waited in the library while we had a break over lunch, then came straight back for games. Another family were blessed with the left over sausages from the barbecue and the parents came back the next day to say thank you.

We are so thankful for the team that came and shared the love of Jesus with these precious kids and the wonderful support of the local churches in St Helens.

SU NATIONAL: 2020 UPDATE

SU Tasmania, together with other state movements, are working towards becoming a national organisation.

This isn't about a head office located somewhere on the mainland. It is about how we can do more localised ministry and effectively utilise the skills and abilities of our people. To help facilitate this, the Director of each state and territory in Australia have developed a framework that recognises the unique elements and DNA that makes us 'Scripture Union'.

Excluding factors outside our control, the SU Tas Council will sign an agreement to form a national movement on 1 October 2020. We expect that the transition to National will be gradual to ensure that the outcome matches the plan.

The most important reason for forming a national movement is to better serve Jesus in his mission with children, young people and families. **Some of the benefits for Tasmania include:**

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES - PEOPLE

We have a range of missional challenges and opportunities and we have a need for volunteers to assist us in undertaking this work. This will also provide additional leadership training opportunities.

AN ABILITY TO EXPAND OUR OPERATIONS

We will be able to increase ministry by placing people into needy and developing communities. 3 PHILANTHROPIC FUNDS / CORPORATE SPONSORSHIP

We are currently limited in our ability to access a range of fundraising opportunities.
